TENNIS PRO

Welcome back everyone! Once again we are very happy to see the green grass and courts ready for play so early. As always, we expect a busy tennis season, filled with activities for all ages and levels. The best way to keep connected to all of the many activities and programs is to check out the club calendar, keep checking the information on the tennis web page, (www.ygtclub.com) and come in to the pro shop.

Kicking off the busy season is the Margarita Mixer on May 7th. Helping to improve your game are the 5 week Spring Clinics which start the week of May 10th. On the weekend of May 15-17, we will be hosting a club filled event to benefit Susan G. Komen Rally For the Cure. There will be Golf on Saturday, Tennis on Sunday, & Bridge on Monday. Last year was a big success and this year we are changing the event to separate days to maximize participation. Everyone is welcome with a \$20 donation. Each person receives a bag of goodies and a great magazine subscription of their choice. The tennis portion of the event will be on Sunday May 16 from 9-11

for all levels, 11-1 for more advanced play, and at 1:30 for middle school and high school players. All are welcome to attend and support this event, so spread the word. Sign ups will be posted throughout the club. Also make sure you line up your mixed doubles guest partner for the Camp Sunshine event July 23rd weekend.

Our staff is very helpful and knowledgeable about the activities that we offer. They can help you with booking courts, share their knowledge on racquet and stringing technology, and help you with your pro shop purchases. Our staff has been working or playing at the club for many years. Our teaching staff is outstanding as many are past juniors in the program and have been the top stars on their tennis teams in high school and college. Adam Gengarella is back to head up the teaching staff and wants to start some new programs with weekly sign ups. There will be a Mens heavy hitters advanced tennis group (4.0+) on Weds nights 5-7 starting May 5th and a Womens (3.5++) advanced play on Sunday mornings 8-10 starting May 23rd. Saturday mornings from 9:30-10:30 in May, there will be a weekly Stroke of the Week clinic. Cardio Tennis is a fun cardio workout on Saturday from 8:30-9:30 in May. These are just some of the programs we offer and they are a great way to go! t to meet other tennis playing members and improve your game. Ball machine usage and private lessons are available 7 days a week. Just call ahead or sign up at the pro shop for these and all events. Please remember to always sweep the court after you play.

After each season, the tennis committee reviews all programs and events in order to maximize court usage and activity. As a result of this review, there will be a change this season with the Mens Drop In program on Monday nights. The Mens Drop in for all levels will use 4 courts from 3:30-5. The more competitive level is now at 5:00 and will use courts 1-4. If you aren't sure which level you should come to, ask one of us or show up at 3:30 and give it a try. Also On Monday nights at 5:00, we are adding a Womens Drop In on courts 5-8. The Drop In programs start on May 17th and remember to sign in when you show up ready to play.

In our tennis pro shop, our prices are always fair and competitive and we match prices from other stores. Obviously, we are a small tennis shop where we can give you the attention and information needed when trying out racquets, and we appreciate your support. We stock and sell Prince, Babolat and Head racquets, and we offer demos for you to try out. The demo charge goes toward your purchase so you can take your time figuring out your new racquet. If you aren't in the market for a new racquet-our restringing special in May is also a big help to your game. You should always get new strings in the beginning of your tennis season and usually later on in the summer. Many factors affect your racquet –weather, type of play, court surfaces, non-use, and even how you store your racquet.

The tennis building has proved to be a busy social activity center. The elevated views from the decks are great for those sitting out and watching tennis. All of the Friday night mixers and holiday mixers are extremely popular. For the large holiday mixers, to accommodate and maximize tennis play for all, we will have sign ups for staggered times so there will be constant tennis. You can sign up for play from 8:00-10 or 10-12. The Friday night mixers will be always starting at 5:00 with sign ups limited as well. Balls will be supplied and there will be a \$5.00 nominal charge to your club account. For all the mixers there will be a drawing for winners that will receive pro shop gift certificates. Bar drinks and food charges will be charged to your club account by the café. The café does a great job of keeping the tennis bar stocked with the tennis players favorite drinks and munchies.

On a sad note, we lost some very active tennis players this winter. We start the season without Shirley Marble. Shirley for the past 18 years was a fixture on the tennis staff and on the tennis court. She was a very dedicated employee, friend and YGT Club member and she served many years as a member of the tennis committee. Hello everyone, welcome back! I know after a long winter everyone is anxious to get out those golf clubs and get back out onto the course. The course opened for play on April 5th and is in great shape. I encourage everyone to come down and enjoy the course. For those who would like to work on their game off the course, the range is open for use and we are currently hitting off grass. With both the course and the range open for play, prospects are great for getting your game up and running early this season!

Looking to start the season off fresh with new equipment? Mark your calendars for our annual Demo Day, June 2nd from 2:30-6pm. Representatives from golf's top brands (Cleveland, Cobra, Titleist, Ping and more!) will be here to help you find the perfect clubs to fit your swing. All the major manufactures have released equipment featuring exciting new technology—make sure to come check it out! If you can't make it to the Demo Day, the Pro Shop will still be offering a great variety of demo equipment available all season long. In addition, club fittings are available daily and can be scheduled at your convenience.

The York Golf Tournament schedule this year offers opportunities for players of all abilities and I encourage all to join in. A reminder to social members, you are eligible to play in all tournaments except board events tournaments which are displayed on the wall of champions in the club house.

Coming up, we have a Men's & Women's Mixed Breakfast Tournament on May 15th. The tournament will go off with a shotgun start at 9am and breakfast will be served beginning at 7:30. The format will be 2 Bestballs of the foursome with 100% handicap. Make sure to come out for a great day of golf!

The annual Memorial Day Mixed Scramble will be held on Monday, May 31st. Tee times for this event will begin at 11am. This is always a fun event and a great way to spend the holiday...I hope you are able to join us!

June will kick off with a Blind Draw Member-Member Tournament on the 5th. A cocktail party from 5-7pm will be held on Friday, June 4th during which teams for the tournament will be drawn. This club favorite is a great way to meet other members who may even become season-long playing partners! Save this date for this popular event!

The U.S.G.A. handicap system is available for posting scores. Remember that all rounds are acceptable for handicap purposes. Both 9 and 18 hole rounds must be posted. If you play less than 9 holes or less than 18 holes, the Pro Shop staff will assist you if you need help making the required adjustments to post a score. Posting all scores makes every participant in the

handicap system more competitive in tournament play.

The tee time lottery system is now in effect for Fridays, Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays. Anyone interested in playing during these times should turn in a lottery slip, including singles and twosomes. Times for Friday are drawn on Tuesday evening and for Saturday & Sunday on Wednesday evening.

Golf lessons are now available. Lessons are a great way to get your swing tuned up for a new season and ensure you a reinforcing positive habits. In addition to private lessons, a series of 5 Ladies' Golf Clinics will be offered again this season beginning May 18th, 4-5pm. These clinics are a great way for beginners to learn the fundamentals and prepare for play on the course.

They also offer more experienced players the opportunity to hone their skills and gain confidence in their swing. Those interested in participating can call the Pro Shop to sign up. My staff and I are looking forward to seeing you and hope you will enjoy the upcoming season at York Golf & Tennis.

A MESSAGE FROM THE HANDICAP COMMITTEE –

Welcome to another year of great golf at YG&TC. We trust you all 'wintered' well.

Please be reminded that the purpose of the USGA Handicap System is to make the game of golf more enjoyable by enabling players of differing abilities to compete on an equitable basis. The system provides a fair Course Handicap for each player regardless of ability and adjusts a player's Handicap Index up or down as the player's game changes. Two basic premises underlie the USGA Handicap System: First that each player will try to make the best score at every hole in every round and second that the player will post every acceptable round.

Following are a few reminders regarding your responsibilities as a golfer, the first and most important is to 'post' all your scores. The Maine golf season 'opened' April 15th, so since that date you should have been posting your 9-hole and 18-hole scores. Do NOT wait to post a 9-hole score.....the computer can handle it.....just touch "9 Holes" on the appropriate screen.....there are also selections for 'inside nine' and others on the computer. Also, if you only play 7 or 8 holes you should post a 9-hole score and if you only play 13 to 17 holes you should post an 18-hole score. Unplayed holes are scored based on your course handicap, that is if you are an 18 handicap you take 'bogey' for each unplayed hole.

NOTE: Unlike previous years, new handicaps will be effective on the 1st and 15th of each month.

Internet posting is available along with the computer in the clubhouse. Posting scores from all courses, home and away, has been made as easy as possible for players to record every round played. Also, all members' posted scores are readily accessible for peer review on the clubhouse computer.....take a look!!!

SUPERINTENDENT'S CORNER

The winter was relatively kind to the course and we were able to open earlier than any year since 1981. This is remarkable considering we received over a foot of rain in March. Over the winter about 20 trees were intentionally removed and dozens more were blown over by high winds. Our course improvement plan for the year is modest, involving mainly bunker renovations and more drainage work on holes 12 and 3.

The other planned improvement involves increasing the teeing ground on the practice range. According to Dave Oatis, the Northeast Regional Director of the USGA Green Section since 1990, "...the typical private course needs at least one acre and preferably two (or more) of usable teeing area. Courses with an acre or less generally have to limit usage, rely on artificial

turf, and/or suffer with more wear.” Even after the planned additions to our tee, we will still be shy of one half acre. Our tee also has a poor orientation to spring and fall sunshine to the critical east and south. This means that the divot production of the membership exceeds the staff’s most diligent efforts to re-establish turf. Since usage is not limited, and mats are never used at York, we shall suffer with more wear, A.K.A : dirt.

That being said, your help is required to make the most of our practice tee. We ask that any practice producing divots be done between the red or white station dividers. Monday, Wednesday, and Friday use the white or left side of the tee. On Tuesday, Thursday and weekends please use the red or right side. Only if no stations are open, may you spread over to the other side, using the nearest available slot. This will enable our staff to optimize divot recovery time, and hopefully result in a better practice facility. You may occasionally find the red or white stakes in front of the practice tee. Please refrain from hitting woods at those times.

Another area where your help would be appreciated is on the chipping green. Please make no shots onto this green that will produce ball marks. This is requested for safety’s sake and also to allow those who choose to practice chipping a surface that more closely resembles our greens than the surface of an asteroid. Our range needs a few target greens for pitching practice and plans are in place for their eventual construction.

Also, please note that the practice tee is closed for range mowing etc., usually on Tuesday until about 10:00 AM. Weather or tournaments may change this schedule, so be sure to check with the Pro shop.

Thanks to Woody: A tribute was paid to our Equipment Technician, Thurston “Woody” Woodward last fall marking the conclusion of his 25th year at the Club. Our current staff and families along with quite a few former employees got to yell “ SURPRISE!” to the unsuspecting mechanic in the Old Club House. President Brent Mohr delivered a moving tribute, (Many of us were a bit teary eyed), and presented him with a tropical shirt, (too small!) with a pair of tickets to Hawaii in the pocket. By all accounts Woody and his wife Sheri had a great time.

When he came to the club in late 1984 he was faced with a fleet of severely antiquated equipment, some of it dating back to the 1950’s He kept that pile of junk operational for many years before we gradually began to update our fleet I could fill this issue of Score with examples of the countless benefit he has reaped for the club over the past quarter century. His knowledge of small engines is encyclopedic, he can fabricate almost anything, and he is at least well versed in all the building trades. Equally important is his wonderful temperament, a most uncommon trait among the best golf course mechanics. . Today the challenge of keeping a bunch of junk functional has been replaced with understanding the complexities of modern equipment.

I am fortunate and grateful to have worked with him for the past couple of decades and hope we have another few together. Moreover, I am fortunate to work for a Club that recognizes and appreciates the value of an employee who could not be more “behind the scene”, yet more essential.

I look forward to introducing a few new items from the chef as well as expanding our garden selection. Finally I would like to announce that beginning Memorial Day weekend we will have the beverage cart on the course Friday, Saturday, and Sundays throughout the season. In addition to the cart being in operation during the weekends, we will utilize this service on both Monday, and Wednesday afternoons to accommodate the golf leagues.

FINANCE COMMITTEE

The finance committee (comprised of Jeffrey McConnell, Chairman, Mark McGreevy, Robert Martel, Carla Robinson, and Kirk Todd), held meetings during the fall to review the budget requests from our department heads

.
During the past few years, the dues have increased by percentages ranging from 8.5% to 4.6%. Due to the tough economy; our concerns for everyone's personal budgets, we were determined to keep this year's increase as low as feasible and at the same time keep the high level of service and improving the grounds which our members have come to enjoy.

With this in mind - we have approved the following capital improvements.

1. Repair the OCH columns under the building
2. Tennis Maintenance/upgrades
3. NCH space heaters
3. OCH outside painting

4. NCH Kitchen upgrade
5. Re-pave cart path between 3 green and 4 tee
6. 3 point hitch mounted snow blower
7. Replace Green Jacket ice shield foam insulation
8. 1 maintenance cart trade in replacement
9. Purchase 20 Alterna-mats- for travel over muddy conditions
10. Replace reels for fairway mowers
11. Fix drainage on 12 fairway
12. Replace fence behind the maintenance shop

The capital improvements- along with the increases to operating expenses- calculated to a 2.4% increase in dues for 2010.

This year there were many difficult decisions to be made. I want to thank the Finance Committee for their time, Bob Todd and John Laprey for all their help with providing timely financial information.

We have worked to fine-tune the 2010 tennis program and are anticipating a fabulous season!

To topline the major changes:

Guest policy: Guest fees have been increased to \$15, with local guests being welcome to play twice a month, up to a total 8 times/season. House guests are welcome up to 8 times/2 week period.

Monday Night Drop-in: Last season this program floundered, so in an attempt to lure players back, we have restructured the format. Beginning May 17th, all levels of play invited for the 3:30 time slot; more competitive players are welcome at 5:00 to accommodate workers who cannot make the 3:30 time slot.
